HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 66

RECOGNIZING, MARCH 27, 2018, AS "GIRL SCOUT DAY" IN THE STATE OF DELAWARE.

1 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts is recognized as a national leader in providing the best leadership development
2 experience in the world for girls; and

3 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts brings time-tested methods and research backed programs that speak to the strengths of
4 girl leadership development, backed by more than 100 years of experience and expertise in the field; and

5 WHEREAS, in Girl Scouts, girls develop their leadership potential through activities that enable them to discover
6 their values, skills, and the world around them, connecting with others in a multicultural environment; and

7 WHEREAS, Girl Scouting is continuing a legacy of creating gender balanced leadership in the United States and
8 the world in its second century of service to girls, by providing girls with the tools to become leaders dedicated to making
9 this country and the world a better place; and

10 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts offers hands-on, girl-led, girl-centered learning in STEM, the outdoors, and
11 entrepreneurship, and abundant opportunities to develop invaluable life skills, helping all girls take the lead early and often;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, only Girl Scouts offers girls a one-of-a-kind opportunity to become a Gold Award Girl Scout by
14 engaging in leadership at the highest levels while addressing an issue they feel passionately about; and

15 WHEREAS, the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor a Girl Scout can earn, acknowledges each recipient's
16 power and dedication to not only bettering herself, but to making the world a better place for others; and

17 WHEREAS, Girl Scouts was founded in 1912 by Juliette Gordon Low whose life mission was to build girls of
18 courage, confidence, and character and through her legacy continues to have an extraordinary influence on the lives of
19 millions of girls across the country; and

20 WHEREAS, today, more than 59 million American women are Girl Scout alumnae and 2.6 million girls and adult
21 volunteers are active members;

22 NOW, THEREFORE:

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 149th General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the
24 Senate concurring therein, that that March 27, 2018, shall be recognized as "Girl Scout Day" in the State of Delaware in
25 celebration and recognition of the Girl Scout Movement and Girl Scouts of the Chesapeake Bay where girls thrive and
26 develop their talents and leadership skills.
