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## HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 149th GENERAL ASSEMBLY

## HOUSE BILL NO. 432

AN ACT TO AMEND THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS INVOLVING THE TRANSFER OF STATE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUNCTIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1 Section 1. Amend § 8702A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and 2 insertions as shown by underline as follows: 3 § 8702A. Definitions. 4 As used in this chapter: 5 (1) "Board" means the Tourism Advisory Board created by § 8708A of this title. 6 (2) "Council" means the Council on Development Finance created by § 8707A of this title. 7 (3) "Director" means the Director of the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism. (4) "Division" means the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism. 8 9 (5) "Plan" means the Comprehensive State Plan for Economic Development created by § 8705A of this title. (6) "Public/Private Partnership" means a nonprofit corporation not established by the General Assembly 10 consisting of business and community leaders and public officials formed to enhance the State's ability to attract, grow 11 12 and retain businesses; facilitate the development of a stronger entrepreneurial and innovative economic system within 13 the State; coordinate with the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism; and, support private employers 14 within the State in identifying, recruiting and developing talent for the operation of their business within the State. 15 (7) "Secretary" means the Secretary of State. (8) "State" means the State of Delaware. 16 17 Section 2. Amend § 8703A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strikethrough and insertions as shown by underline as follows: 18 19 § 8703A. Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism — Created; purposes. 20 (a) There is hereby created a division of economic development which shall be known as the Division of Small

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Business, Development and Tourism within the Department of State.

29	c. The Plan shall be submitted every 5 years to the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate
30	Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Secretary, and, for public distribution, to the Director of the Division
31	of Research of Legislative Council and the Director of Public Archives. The Division shall also publish the Plan
32	on the Division's public website. The initial Plan is due December 1, 2020.
33	Section 5. Amend § 8707A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strikethrough and

36	(c) The Council shall be composed of 9 members who are Delaware residents. The Governor shall appoint 7

38	large members. The President Pro Tempore of the state Senate shall appoint 1 member of the Senate and the Speaker of the
39	state House of Representatives shall appoint 1 member of the House of Representatives. Council members shall serve for 3-
40	year terms and may be reappointed. Council members appointed after July 1, 2018, may be reappointed for only 1
41	additional 3-year term.
42	(h) Any appointment, pursuant to this section, to replace a member whose position becomes vacant prior to the
43	expiration of the member's term shall be filled only for the remainder of that term. However, a person who is appointed to
44	fill such a vacancy may be reappointed. Any person appointed to fill such a vacancy after July 1, 2018, may be reappointed
45	for only 2, 3-year terms.
46	(i) The Council shall conduct its business only when a quorum is present. A quorum shall consist of 5 of the 9
47	members being physically present in person, by telephone, or by videoconference. The consent of a majority of the quorum
48	is required for approval on any vote. Upon written request from the Council, the Governor may declare a vacancy for any
49	member who is absent from 4 consecutive Council meetings. The Council Chair should schedule meetings so that they are
50	centrally located and geographically balanced in number.

60	population, demographics and economy of the State. The Division shall take such steps as the Director deems appropriate
61	to emphasize the investment, business, employment and recreational opportunities and advantages of the State, and the
62	potential for future development within the State.
63	Section 8. Amend § 8716A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
64	insertions as shown by underline as follows:
65	§ 8716A. Reports.
66	(a) The Division shall submit an annual report on or before September 1 of each year. The annual report shall
67	detail the status of the Division's efforts to meet the vision, goals, objectives, strategies, and economic indicators included
68	in its comprehensive economic development planning. The Division shall submit 1 annual report on or before December 1
69	of each year that includes all of the following information:
70	(1) The status of the Division's efforts to meet the vision, goals, objectives, strategies, and economic
71	indicators included in its comprehensive economic development planning.
72	(2) A summary of the work of the Council on Development Finance.
73	(3) The uses of the Delaware Strategic Fund for the previous year. The Director shall notify the Co-
74	Chairs of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Capital Improvement Program on the remaining Strategic Fund
75	balance available for commitment.
76	(4) The status of assistance for small business, including the Small Business Technology Transfer
77	Program and the Small Business Innovative Research Program.
78	(5) The programs and funding under the Delaware Economic Development Training Act authorized by
79	Subchapter VIII of this chapter, including an evaluation of the performance of each program, a summary of the

80	public moneys expended and an analysis of the participants in the programs, a report on the number of minority
81	and economically disadvantaged individuals included in the programs.
82	(6) The names of all certified sponsor and new business firms, the total amount of tax credits awarded,
83	and the number of jobs created under the new business certification tax program.
84	(b) The Division shall submit a summary of the work of the Council on Development Finance on or before
85	October 15 of each year. The Division shall notify the Co-Chairs of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Capital
86	Improvement Program of its intention to make a commitment of funds from the Strategic Fund before the commitment
87	being made to the intended recipient of the funds.
88	Section 9. Amend § 8729A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

103	The Division shall annually report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before January 15. [Repealed.]

106	Section 12. Amend § 8750A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

109	(a) There is hereby established the Delaware Motion Picture and Television Development Commission (the
110	"Commission") which shall consist of 9 members who shall be residents of the State and shall consist of the following:
111	(1) Director of the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism or the Director's designee;
112	(2) Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control;
113	(3) Three members appointed by the Governor;

127	housing problems for low- and moderate-income residents of Liberty Court Apartments, Dover, Delaware, thereby

129	Section 14. Amend § 8753A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

131	§ 8753A. Established; organization.
132	(g) The Authority shall prepare an annual budget for each fiscal year of the Authority (the "annual budget") and
133	shall submit the annual budget to the Director of the Office of Management and Budget and General Assembly with the
134	Department of State's budget request in accordance with Chapter 63 of this title. The annual budget need not include
135	amounts representing expenditures for debt service on bonds, except for such amounts with respect to projects which are
136	financed by proceeds from state-guaranteed bonds and for which either:
137	(1) Any payment due to the Authority or to a trustee or other person as assignee of the Authority is in default;

149	(21) To acquire all of the issued and outstanding stock of Dover-Del Housing Corp., a Delaware nonprofit
150	housing development corporation, and to serve as the sole member thereof during such period of time that Liberty
151	Court Apartments, Dover, Delaware, is being rehabilitated and, upon completion of such rehabilitation, to cause
152	Dover-Del Housing Corp. to convey title to such apartments to the Delaware State Housing Authority for such
153	consideration as the Authority shall, at such time, deem adequate and, as soon as practicable thereafter, to divest its
154	interest in Dover-Del Housing Corp., and to take any and all other actions deemed to be necessary or appropriate by the
155	Authority in connection with the foregoing. [Repealed.]
156	Section 16. Amend § 8773A, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

159	The Director, in the annual report required by § 8716A(a) of this title shall include, but not be limited to,
160	descriptions of all programs funded, an evaluation of the performance of each program, a summary of the public moneys
161	expended and an analysis of the participants in the programs, to include a report on the number of minority and
162	economically disadvantaged individuals[Repealed.]
163	Section 17. Amend § 5112, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
164	insertions as shown by underline as follows:
165	§ 5112. Employees not to be supplied with, nor reimbursed for, food consumed during working hours; exceptions.
166	(b) Subsection (a) of this section shall not apply to:
167	(1) Employees of state agencies who regularly receive wages in kind in addition to their salaries;

182	Century Fund for Neighborhood Housing Revitalization shall be used to create a program to be administered according
183	to guidelines and procedures developed by the Council on Housing and the State Housing Director to expand
184	affordable housing opportunities for families and improve entire communities through the rehabilitation of existing

189	(d) There is established an interagency work group comprised of 1 representative from the Office of Managemen

191	Development and Tourism, the Department of Transportation and the Department of Health and Social Services. This work
192	group shall be known as the State Materials Recycling Team (SMRT) and its members shall be appointed by the respective
193	Department heads. The Chair of the SMRT will be selected by the team's membership. The work group's primary purposes
194	shall be:
195	Section 20. Amend § 7601, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

There is hereby established the Delaware State Clearinghouse Committee for federal grant and nonfederal grant coordination. The Fund shall be used to incentivize investments in energy efficiency by consumers or users of gas or electricity whose purchase of those commodities from a distributor is subject to the public utility tax on gas or electricity imposed by Chapter 55 of Title 30. The Department shall support implementation of projects that reduce the use of gas, electricity, or other sources through the issuance of competitive grants, low-interest loans, or other financing support from the Fund. The Department shall establish the contents and deadline for applications for financing from the Fund and shall

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give preference to those applications proposing projects that are anticipated to produce the greatest reduction in energy
consumption per Fund dollar invested, improve environmental performance, spur capital construction and facility
modernization, encourage job retention and creation, and are likely to be substantially complete no later than 1 year
following the issuance of financing from the Fund. In no event shall the Fund provide grant funding for more than 30
percent of the costs of any proposed project or support projects already receiving support from the Green Energy Fund
under this chapter or the Strategic Fund under subchapter II of Chapter 87A of this title. The Fund shall be administered in
consultation with the Sustainable Energy Utility and the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism
Department. The Department shall make an annual report on the use of the Energy Efficiency Investment Fund and the
value of energy savings resulting therefrom to the Governor's Energy Advisory Council and the General Assembly not later
than August 30 of each year after 2011. The Department shall retain no more than 4 percent of the Fund for expenses to
administer this section. All terms used herein that are defined in Chapter 55 of Title 30 shall have the same definition used
in that chapter.
Section 23. Amend § 8053, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

## **SYNOPSIS**

The Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism was created by 81 Del. Laws ch. 49 and placed in the Department of State. This enactment transferred certain responsibilities for economic development, formerly in the Delaware Department of Economic Development, to this Division.

The purpose of this Act is to address administrative housekeeping matters involving this transfer of responsibilities for economic development. Specifically, this Act changes the name of the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism to the Division of Small Business. The Division of Small Business will remain in the Department of State and be responsible for economic development activities transferred to the Division of Small Business, Development and Tourism in 81 Del. Laws ch. 49.

This Act also does the following:

- (1) Sets a new date for the submission of the Comprehensive State Plan for Economic Development and unifies the economic development reporting requirements of the Division of Small Business.
  - (2) Limits the terms of members of the Council on Development Finance ("Council") appointed after July 1, 2018.
- (3) Eliminates the requirement that all Council members be physically present to constitute a quorum for meetings, to foster greater efficiency in making economic development recommendations to the Division of Small Business.
- (4) Further deletes reference to programs governed by prior acts of the General Assembly such as the Agriculture/Aquaculture Program, the Liberty Court Apartments project, and the Human Investment and Partnership Program, to the extent that these programs are no longer active.

Finally this Act makes technical corrections to conform existing law to the standards of the Delaware Legislative Drafting Manual.

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
