(a) There is created a State Human Relations Commission which shall consist of 28 members. Each county of the State shall be represented by 7 members, and 7 members shall be selected without regard to the county in which they reside. The members shall be appointed by the Governor and shall be broadly representative of various racial and cultural groups of the State. Seven of the original members shall be appointed for a term of 1 year, 7 for a term of 2 years, 7 for a term of 3 years and 7 for a term of 4 years. Thereafter, all appointments shall be made for terms of 4 years.	Recommendation 2: The Commission shall provide to JLOSC proposed amendments to its governing statue to reduce the size of the Commission from 28 members to a number JLOSC determines.
Discussions at the public hearing included recommendations from the Commission that due to the hearing process, that the membership be 18. The Committee may wish to discuss this further to consider an even smaller number than 18.

A member is deemed in neglect of duty if the member is absent from 3 consecutive Board meetings without good cause or if the member

Recommendation 6: The Commission shall provide to JLOSC proposed amendments to its governing statute to include references to its powers and duties in Chapter 45, Title 6 (Equal Accommodations), and Chapter 46, Title 6 (Fair Housing Act). For example, add to §3004, Title 31, the following: "(4) Fulfill its duties as provided in Chapter 45 of Title 6."
