Recommendation 5: Membership

Change DACCTE's membership as codified in Chapter 86, Title 14, as follows:

- a. Add a non-voting member who is a representative from the Department of Education and selected by the Secretary.
- b. Add a non-voting member who is a student enrolled in a Delaware CTE program.
- c. Limit membership to no more than 2 members fulfilling each qualification currently listed in the statute.
Note: As currently written, there is no limit to the number of members who can be appointed to the Council. DACCTE currently has 14 members. Some qualifications are met by more than 1 member while 3 outlined qualifications are not represented and 2 vacancies are in the process of being filled.
- d. Remove the requirement that the Chairperson is a member of the private sector.
- e. Language shall be added to limit the term of the Chairperson to 5 years, with the ability to serve 1 additional 5 year term.
