

The Community and Impact of Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs)


- HBCUs represent just 3% of all higher education institutions in the United States—there are 101 HBCUs, both public and private—but educate twice as many Pell-eligible students as non-HBCUs.
- HBCUs have graduated:
 - o 40% of all Black engineers;
 - o 40% of all Black US Congress members;
 - 50% of all Black lawyers; and 80% of all Black judges.
- HBCUs also supply more Black applicants to medical schools than non-HBCU institutions.
- Delaware State University is now the #1 choice for students of color in Delaware.





Highlights/KPIs from a Historic 2024

- Inspire Scholarship captured 75% of all new, full-time first-year Delaware students.
- 71% of students are Pell grant eligible.
- 70% of students graduate with work-based learning.
- 91% of faculty now have terminal degrees.
- Early College School now serves **583** students.
- Two new academic buildings in the construction phase –
 ECIC to open May 2025.






An Increasing Commitment from the State of Delaware

Operating and Capital Budget Actuals (\$M) 2017-25






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
DSU's level of state funding falls far behind other public HBCUs.

State Appropriations as % of Core Revenues: Public HBCUs





State Appropriations as % of Core Revenues Public HBCUs in U.S. News and World Report Ranking Order






Largest Research Portfolio in University History





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Growing Revenue Gap

Federal COVID relief funds helped fill this gap for several years, but the University cannot sustain this high level of performance without increased operating support.



Enrollment Growth

Enrollment has grown 25 percent from FY 20 to FY 25, bucking broader higher ed trends and outpacing state support.



Rising Costs

With high inflation and rising costs for several years, tuition, fees and public funding at its current levels do not cover the University's costs.



Historic acquisition of Wesley College has provided critical value to the University, City, County and State, but has also increased both short and long-term costs.


