#### LEGISLATION INTRODUCED DURING THE 2<sup>ND</sup> SESSION OF THE 151<sup>ST</sup> GENERAL ASSEMBLY

#### ENACTMENT RATE<sup>§</sup> OF BILLS INTRODUCED DURING THE 2<sup>ND</sup> SESSION OF THE 151<sup>ST</sup> GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Out of the 238 bills introduced by the House of Representatives during the 2<sup>nd</sup> session, 139 have been enacted into law. This gives an enactment rate of 58%.

Out of the 179 bills introduced by the Senate during the 2<sup>nd</sup> session, 102 have been enacted into law. This gives an enactment rate of 57%.

#### VETOES OF BILLS INTRODUCED DURING THE 2<sup>ND</sup> SESSION OF THE 151<sup>ST</sup> GENERAL ASSEMBLY\*\*

The Governor vetoed 2 bills and pocket vetoed 1 bill that were introduced by the House of Representatives during the 2<sup>nd</sup> session. A motion to override 1 veto was defeated in the House of Representatives.

The Governor did not veto any legislation introduced by the Senate during the 2<sup>nd</sup> session.

\* General Assemblies begin the day after a general election and end the next general election. We have defined the 2<sup>nd</sup> session as beginning the day after the State would have a general election if held in an odd year. For this data, the “2<sup>nd</sup> session” would be 11/3/2021 to 11/8/2022. This includes any legislation introduced in special or extraordinary sessions in this period.

† In this report, each substitute to a bill counts as its own bill. For example, 1 bill with 1 substitute for that bill counts as 2 bills.

‡ In this report, an amendment to an amendment counts as its own piece of legislation. For example, House Amendment 1 to a bill and an amendment to House Amendment 1 would count as 2 amendments.

§ Rounded to the nearest whole number.

\*\* The Governor vetoed House Bill 276 and House Bill 371. The Governor pocket vetoed House Substitute 1 for House Bill 204. A motion to override the veto of House Bill 371 was defeated in the House of Representatives.
