House Redistricting Process

June 2021

General Assembly passes HCR 32 to provide for an open redistricting process.*

September 28, 2021

A joint public hearing is held.



Late October 2021

Revised and final House maps will be posted online.

GA receives Legacy Files from US Census Bureau.

August 2021

Draft House maps and statistics are published online.

October 13, 2021

Special session will be held to vote on House and Senate plans.


November 1, 2021


*HCR 32 sets Nov. 7 as the final deadline for the redistricting process to provide new boundaries one year before Election Day 2021.

Factors in Drawing the Lines

- •State Law: All districts must be formed of contiguous territory; be nearly equal in population; be bounded by major roads, streams, or other natural boundaries; and not be created to unduly favor any person or political party.
- •Federal Law: Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 and majority-minority districts.
- •Other: Communities of interest, political boundaries, census block shapes.

Example: Political Boundaries






Current Lines: Claymont split into RD 07 and RD 10

Example: Census Block Shapes







Census Block Around Homes by Dover Mall

Prisoner Data Update

- This is the first Census in which Delaware will count prisoners at the last address recorded before their incarceration, rather than at the prison they currently inhabit. The software vendor contracted with the General Assembly has worked closely with us to accurately adjust the Census data.
- Adjustments during this process have rendered the Hispanic population totals to be <u>approximate</u> as information was not collected on whether an inmate was of Hispanic origin. This will be addressed in the 2030 redistricting process.



Current Lines: Pop. Deviations


Red: Too little population (<-5% dev.)

Yellow: Too much population (>5% dev.)


Green: Within allowed -5% - 5% dev.



Communities of Interest (NCC)






Current Barley Mill Area in RDs 04 and 12

Communities of Interest (Sussex)




Dove Knoll stayed in the revised 14th RD.
