HOUSE BILL NO. 60

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLES 18, 29, AND 31 RELATING TO BREAST CANCER SCREENING AND DIAGNOSTIC PROCEDURES.

1 WHEREAS, insurance coverage focuses mostly on mammogram screenings; and

2 WHEREAS, the American Cancer Society recommends that high risk-patients or women with dense breast tissue
3 should receive a mammogram and a breast MRI every year starting at the age of 30; and

4 WHEREAS, it is not required for insurers to cover supplemental examinations or follow-up diagnostic screenings,
5 which could result in costs ranging from hundreds to thousands of dollars; and

6 WHEREAS, a 2019 study by the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation cited cost as the primary reason
7 women avoid follow-up diagnostic imaging recommended by their healthcare provider; and

8 WHEREAS, Delawareans should not have to face exorbitant costs for potentially life-saving screenings and
9 follow-up tests.

10 NOW, THEREFORE:

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

12 Section 1. Amend Chapter 35, Title 18 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
13 insertions as shown by underline as follows:

14 § 3552A. Supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations.

15 (a) As used in this section:

16 (1) “Breast magnetic resonance imaging” or “breast MRI” means a diagnostic and screening tool, including
17 standard and abbreviated breast MRI, that uses radio waves and magnets to produce detailed images of structures
18 within the breast.

19 (2) “Breast ultrasound” means a noninvasive diagnostic and screening tool that uses high-frequency sound
20 waves and their echoes to produce detailed images of structures within the breast.

21 (3) “Cost-sharing requirement” means a deductible, coinsurance, or copayment and any maximum limitation
22 on the application of such a deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or similar out-of-pocket expense.

23 (4) “Diagnostic breast examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate examination of
24 the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is used for either of
25 the following:

26 a. To evaluate an abnormality seen or suspected from a screening examination for breast cancer.

27 b. To evaluate an abnormality detected by another means of examination.

28 (5) “Mammogram” means a diagnostic or screening mammography exam using a low-dose X-ray to produce
29 an image of the breast.

30 (6) “Supplemental breast screening examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate
31 examination of the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is
32 used for either of the following:

33 a. To screen for breast cancer when there is no abnormality seen or suspected in the breast.

34 b. Based on personal or family medical history or additional factors that may increase the individual’s
35 risk of breast cancer.

36 (b) All group and blanket health insurance policies which are delivered or issued for delivery in this State by any
37 health insurer or health service corporation and which provide benefits for outpatient services shall provide coverage for
38 diagnostic breast examinations and supplemental breast screening examinations. The terms of such coverage, including
39 cost-sharing requirements, shall be no less favorable than the cost-sharing requirements applicable to screening
40 mammography for breast cancer.

41 Section 2. Amend Chapter 33, Title 18 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
42 insertions as shown by underline as follows:

43 § 3370F. Supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations.

44 (a) As used in this section:

45 (1) “Breast magnetic resonance imaging” or “breast MRI” means a diagnostic and screening tool, including
46 standard and abbreviated breast MRI, that uses radio waves and magnets to produce detailed images of structures
47 within the breast.

48 (2) “Breast ultrasound” means a noninvasive diagnostic and screening tool that uses high-frequency sound
49 waves and their echoes to produce detailed images of structures within the breast.

50 (3) “Cost-sharing requirement” means a deductible, coinsurance, or copayment and any maximum limitation
51 on the application of such a deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or similar out-of-pocket expense.

52 (4) “Diagnostic breast examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate examination of
53 the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is used for either of
54 the following:

55 a. To evaluate an abnormality seen or suspected from a screening examination for breast cancer.

56 b. To evaluate an abnormality detected by another means of examination.

57 (5) “Mammogram” means a diagnostic or screening mammography exam using a low-dose X-ray to produce
58 an image of the breast.

59 (6) “Supplemental breast screening examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate
60 examination of the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is
61 used for either of the following:

62 a. To screen for breast cancer when there is no abnormality seen or suspected in the breast.

63 b. Based on personal or family medical history or additional factors that may increase the individual’s
64 risk of breast cancer.

65 (b) All individual health insurance policies, contracts, or certificates that are delivered, issued for delivery,
66 extended, or modified in this State shall provide coverage for diagnostic breast examinations and supplemental breast
67 screening examinations. The terms of such coverage, including cost-sharing requirements, shall be no less favorable than
68 the cost-sharing requirements applicable to screening mammography for breast cancer.

69 Section 3. Amend Chapter 52, Title 29 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
70 insertions as shown by underline as follows:

71 § 5217. Supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations.

72 (a) As used in this section:

73 (1) “Breast magnetic resonance imaging” or “breast MRI” means a diagnostic and screening tool, including
74 standard and abbreviated breast MRI, that uses radio waves and magnets to produce detailed images of structures
75 within the breast.

76 (2) “Breast ultrasound” means a noninvasive diagnostic and screening tool that uses high-frequency sound
77 waves and their echoes to produce detailed images of structures within the breast.

78 (3) “Cost-sharing requirement” means a deductible, coinsurance, or copayment and any maximum limitation
79 on the application of such a deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or similar out-of-pocket expense.

80 (4) “Diagnostic breast examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate examination of
81 the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is used for either of
82 the following:

83 a. To evaluate an abnormality seen or suspected from a screening examination for breast cancer.

84 b. To evaluate an abnormality detected by another means of examination.

85 (5) “Mammogram” means a diagnostic or screening mammography exam using a low-dose X-ray to produce
86 an image of the breast.

87 (6) “Supplemental breast screening examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate
88 examination of the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is
89 used for either of the following:

90 a. To screen for breast cancer when there is no abnormality seen or suspected in the breast.

91 b. Based on personal or family medical history or additional factors that may increase the individual’s
92 risk of breast cancer.

93 (b) The plan shall provide coverage for diagnostic breast examinations and supplemental breast screening
94 examinations. The terms of such coverage, including cost-sharing requirements, shall be no less favorable than the cost-
95 sharing requirements applicable to screening mammography for breast cancer.

96 Section 4. Amend Chapter 5, Title 31 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and
97 insertions as shown by underline as follows:

98 § 532. Supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations.

99 (a) As used in this section:

100 (1) “Breast magnetic resonance imaging” or “breast MRI” means a diagnostic and screening tool, including
101 standard and abbreviated breast MRI, that uses radio waves and magnets to produce detailed images of structures
102 within the breast.

103 (2) “Breast ultrasound” means a noninvasive diagnostic and screening tool that uses high-frequency sound
104 waves and their echoes to produce detailed images of structures within the breast.

105 (3) “Carrier” means any entity that provides health insurance under § 505(3) of this title.

106 (4) “Cost-sharing requirement” means a deductible, coinsurance, or copayment and any maximum limitation
107 on the application of such a deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or similar out-of-pocket expense.

108 (5) “Diagnostic breast examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate examination of
109 the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is used for either of
110 the following:

111 a. To evaluate an abnormality seen or suspected from a screening examination for breast cancer.

112 b. To evaluate an abnormality detected by another means of examination.

113 (6) “Mammogram” means a diagnostic or screening mammography exam using a low-dose X-ray to produce
114 an image of the breast.

115 (7) “Supplemental breast screening examination” means a medically necessary and clinically appropriate
116 examination of the breast, including such examination using breast MRI, breast ultrasound, or mammogram, that is
117 used for either of the following:

118 a. To screen for breast cancer when there is no abnormality seen or suspected in the breast.

119 b. Based on personal or family medical history or additional factors that may increase the individual’s
120 risk of breast cancer.

121 (b) All carriers shall provide coverage for diagnostic breast examinations and supplemental breast screening
122 examinations. The terms of such coverage, including cost-sharing requirements, shall be no less favorable than the cost-
123 sharing requirements applicable to screening mammography for breast cancer.

124 Section 5. This Act takes effect 60 days after its enactment and is effective for all contracts and coverage initiated
125 or renewed after January 1, 2024.

SYNOPSIS

This Act requires that all insurance policies issued or renewed in this State include coverage of supplemental and diagnostic breast examinations on terms that are at least as favorable as the coverage of annual screening mammograms. The Act covers all group, blanket, and individual health insurance policies as well as the State employee healthcare plan and Medicaid.
