DELAWARE STATE SENATE 150th GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE BILL NO. 22

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 15 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING THE AGREEMENT AMONG THE STATES TO ELECT THE PRESIDENT BY NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1 Section 1. Amend Title 15 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and insertions as 2 shown by underline as follows: 3 Chapter 43A. The Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote; Effect. 4 Subchapter I. The Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote. § 4300A. Adoption of the Agreement Among The States To Elect The President By National Popular Vote. 5 6 This State hereby enters into the Agreement Among The States To Elect The President By National Popular Vote 7 ("agreement") with all other jurisdictions legally joining the agreement in form substantially as set forth in this chapter. 8 § 4301A. Article I; Membership. 9 Any state of the United States and the District of Columbia may become a member of this agreement by enacting 10 this agreement. 11 § 4302A. Article II; Right of the people in member states to vote for President and Vice President. 12 Each member state shall conduct a statewide popular election for President and Vice President of the United 13 States. 14 § 4303A. Article III; Manner of appointing presidential electors in member states. 15 (a) Prior to the time set by law for the meeting and voting by the presidential electors, the chief election official of 16 each member state shall determine the number of votes for each presidential slate in each state of the United States and the 17 District of Columbia in which votes have been cast in a statewide popular election and shall add such votes together to 18 produce a "national popular vote total" for each presidential slate.

19	(b) The chief election official of each member state shall designate the presidential slate with the largest national
20	popular vote total as the "national popular vote winner."
21	(c) The presidential elector certifying official of each member state shall certify the appointment in that official's
22	own state of the elector slate nominated in that state in association with the national popular vote winner.
23	(d) At least 6 days before the day fixed by law for the meeting and voting by the presidential electors, each
24	member state shall make a final determination of the number of popular votes cast in the state for each presidential slate and
25	shall communicate an official statement of such determination within 24 hours to the chief election official of each other
26	member state.
27	(e) The chief election official of each member state shall treat as conclusive an official statement containing the
28	number of popular votes in a state for each presidential slate made by the day established by federal law for making a
29	state's final determination conclusive as to the counting of electoral votes by Congress.
30	(f) In event of a tie for the national popular vote winner, the presidential elector certifying official of each member
31	state shall certify the appointment of the elector slate nominated in association with the presidential slate receiving the
32	largest number of popular votes within that official's own state.
33	(g) If, for any reason, the number of presidential electors nominated in a member state in association with the
34	national popular vote winner is less than or greater than that state's number of electoral votes, the presidential candidate on
35	the presidential slate that has been designated as the national popular vote winner shall have the power to nominate the
36	presidential electors for that state and that state's presidential elector certifying official shall certify the appointment of such
37	nominees.
38	(h) The chief election official of each member state shall immediately release to the public all vote counts or
39	statements of votes as they are determined or obtained.
40	(i) This article shall govern the appointment of presidential electors in each member state in any year in which this
41	agreement is, on July 20, in effect in states cumulatively possessing a majority of the electoral votes.
42	§ 4304A. Article IV; Other provisions.
43	(a) This agreement shall take effect when states cumulatively possessing a majority of the electoral votes have
44	enacted this agreement in substantially the same form and the enactments by such states have taken effect in each state.
45	(b) Any member state may withdraw from this agreement, except that a withdrawal occurring 6 months or less
46	before the end of a President's term shall not become effective until a President or Vice President shall have been qualified
47	to serve the next term

48	(c) The chief executive of each member state shall promptly notify the chief executive of all other states of when
49	this agreement has been enacted and has taken effect in that official's state, when the state has withdrawn from this
50	agreement, and when this agreement takes effect generally.
51	(d) This agreement terminates if the electoral college is abolished.
52	(e) If any provision of this agreement is held invalid, the remaining provisions shall not be affected.
53	§ 4305A. Article V; Definitions.
54	For purposes of this agreement:
55	(1) "Chief executive" shall mean the Governor of a state of the United States or the Mayor of the District
56	of Columbia.
57	(2) "Elector slate" shall mean a slate of candidates who have been nominated in a state for the position of
58	presidential elector in association with a presidential slate.
59	(3) "Chief election official" shall mean the state official or body that is authorized to certify the total
60	number of popular votes for each presidential slate.
61	(4) "Presidential elector" shall mean an elector for President and Vice President of the United States.
62	(5) "Presidential elector certifying official" shall mean the state official or body that is authorized to
63	certify the appointment of the state's presidential electors.
64	(6) "Presidential slate" shall mean a slate of two persons, the first of whom has been nominated as a
65	candidate for President of the United States and the second of whom has been nominated as a candidate for Vice
66	President of the United States, or any legal successors to such persons, regardless of whether both names appear
67	on the ballot presented to the voter in a particular state.
68	(7) "State" shall mean a state of the United States and the District of Columbia.
69	(8) "Statewide popular election" shall mean a general election in which votes are cast for presidential
70	slates by individual voters and counted on a statewide basis.
71	Subchapter II. Effect of the Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote.
72	§ 4306A. Effect; State Election Commissioner duties.
73	(a) The State Election Commissioner shall provide written notice to the Registrar of Regulations that is published
74	in the Register of Regulations when Subchapter I of this chapter, the Agreement Among The States To Elect The President
75	by National Popular Vote, governs a presidential election.
76	(b) If, after providing notice under subsection (a) of this section, Subchapter I of this chapter, the Agreement

123	(a) Except as in this chapter otherwise provided, the otherwise provided in this chapter, the election of delegates
124	shall <u>must</u> be conducted and the results thereof ascertained and certified in the same manner as in the case of the election of
125	electors of President and Vice-President Vice President in this State and the during elections in which Subchapter I of
126	Chapter 43A of this title does not govern.
127	(b) The Governor shall, without delay, examine the certificates and ascertain the delegates to such convention
128	chosen and make known the same by proclamation and cause notice to be given to each delegate so elected of the delegate's
129	election as a delegate. All provisions of the laws of this State relative to elections, except as far as inconsistent with this
130	chapter, shall be applicable to such election.
131	Section 6. Sections 1, 2, 3, and 5 of this Act take effect upon their enactment into law. Section 1 of this Act applies
132	to a presidential election whenever the State Election Commissioner provides notice under § 4306A of Section 1 of this Act
133	that the Agreement Among The States To Elect The President By National Popular Vote in Section 1 of this Act governs a
134	presidential election. Section 4 of this Act takes effect whenever the State Election Commissioner provides notice under §

SYNOPSIS

Act enacts the National Popular Vote compact, which changes the Electoral College from an institution that reflects the voters' state-by-state choices into a body that reflects the voters' nationwide choice. Currently, state statutes require that electoral votes are controlled by the plurality of the voters in the state but this system is not required by the U.S. Constitution or federal law. The National Popular Vote compact requires that each member state award its electoral votes to the presidential candidate who received the largest number of popular votes in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. The National Popular Vote compact becomes effective when it is enacted by states collectively possessing a majority of the electoral votes. When the National Popular Vote compact takes effect, the presidential candidate receiving the most popular votes in all 50 states and the District of Columbia would be guaranteed enough electoral votes in the Electoral College to be elected to the Presidency.

Specifically, this Act does the following:

Section 1. Adopts The Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote ("National Popular Vote compact") and provides for notice regarding when the National Popular Vote compact is in effect and governs a presidential election.

Section 2. Revises the wording of § 4303(b) so that it correctly addresses how electors must vote in any presidential election. This is not a substantive change to current law, which governs when the National Popular Vote compact is not applicable to an election, because the electors nominated by the political party that received the plurality of vote of the voters of this State are the electors who are appointed.

Section 3. Corrects a typographical error in § 5711.

Section 4. Revises § 5711 to govern when the National Popular Vote compact governs a presidential election. Both versions of § 5711 will appear in the Delaware Code with a note at the top of each version stating if that version governs the next presidential election.

Section 5. Revises § 7704 of Title 15 regarding the election of delegates to a state constitutional convention to ratify proposed amendments to the U.S. Constitution so that it remains unchanged by the National Popular Vote compact. The statute currently provides that delegates are elected "in the same manner as in the case of the election for electors for President and Vice President." Because the National Popular Vote compact changes how electors are selected, § 7704 is revised so that delegates to a national constitutional convention are nominated and elected in the current manner, regardless of whether the National Popular Vote compact governs the next presidential election.

Section 6. Clarifies the effective date of this Act and when Section 1 of this Act governs a presidential election.
