## HOUSE BILL NO. 440

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 11 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST THE PERSON.

- 3 § 607. Strangulation <u>or suffocation;</u> penalty; affirmative defense.
- 4 (a) (1) A person commits the offense of strangulation if the person knowingly or intentionally impedes the <u>normal</u>

5 breathing or circulation of the blood of another person by applying pressure on the throat or neck of the other person.

6 (2) A person commits the offense of suffocation if the person knowingly or intentionally prevents another

7 person from breathing by blocking or obstructing the nose or mouth of the other person.

- 8 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph  $\frac{a}{3}$  (b)(2) of this section, strangulation and sufficient is a class  $\neq$  D
- 9 felony.

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(2) (3) Strangulation or suffocation is a class D B felony if:

- a. The person used or attempted to use a dangerous instrument or a deadly weapon while committing the
- 12 offense; or
- b. The person caused serious physical injury to the other person while committing the offense; or
  - c. The person has been previously convicted of strangulation. Strangulation or suffocation; or
- 15 <u>d. The person was subject to an existing court order prohibiting contact with the victim at the time of the</u>
- 16 <u>offense.</u>
  - e. The person committed the offense against a pregnant female
- 18 (c) Notwithstanding any provisions of this Code to the contrary, any person who commits an offense under
- 19 subsection (a) of this section within 5 years of a prior conviction under either subsection (a) or (b) of this section or a
- 20 <u>substantially similar section of another state, shall receive a minimum sentence of 1 year at Level 5.</u>
- 21 (d) The absence of visible bodily injury shall not preclude a conviction under this section.

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- (b) (e) It is an affirmative defense that an act constituting strangulation was the result of a legitimate medical
- 23 procedure.

## **SYNOPSIS**

This bill changes the definition of and class of felony for the crime of Strangulation from a class C felony to a Class D felony unless additional factors are present, then the crime elevates to a class B felony, punishable from 2-25 years in jail. This bill also adds the crime of suffocation.
