DELAWARE STATE SENATE 152nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7

WHEREAS, there are nearly 7,000 diseases and conditions considered rare (each affecting fewer than 200,000

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2	Americans) in the United States, according to the National Institutes of Health (NIH); and
3	WHEREAS, while each of these diseases may affect small numbers of people, rare diseases as a group affect
4	almost 30 million Americans; and
5	WHEREAS, many rare diseases are serious and debilitating conditions that have a significant impact on the lives
6	of those affected; and
7	WHEREAS, while more than 450 drugs and biologics have been approved for the treatment of rare diseases
8	according to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), millions of Americans still have rare diseases for which there is no
9	approved treatment; and
10	WHEREAS, individuals and families affected by rare diseases often experience problems such as diagnosis delay,
11	difficulty finding a medical expert, and lack of access to treatments or ancillary services; and
12	WHEREAS, while the public is familiar with some rare diseases such as "Lou Gehrig's disease" and sympathetic
13	to those affected, many patients and families affected by less widely known rare diseases bear a large share of the burden of
14	funding research and raising public awareness to support the search for treatments; and
15	WHEREAS, one example of a rare disease is Lissencephaly, a condition that is characterized by agyria or
16	pachygyria, which means absence or incomplete development, respectively, of the brain gyri or convolution, causing the
17	brain's surface to appear unusually smooth with an estimated less than 1,000 individuals diagnosed worldwide and many
18	others undiagnosed; and
19	WHEREAS, thousands of Delaware residents are among those affected by rare diseases since nearly one in 10
20	Americans have rare diseases; and
21	WHEREAS, the National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD) organized a nationwide observance of "Rare
22	Disease Day" on February 28, 2023; and

WHEREAS, thousands of patients and caregivers, medical professionals, researchers, companies developing orphan products to treat people with rare diseases, and others in the State of Delaware will participate in that observance.

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 152nd General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that February 28, 2023, is recognized as "Rare Disease Day" in the State of Delaware.

This Senate Concurrent Resolution recognizes February 28, 2023, as "Rare Disease Day" in Delaware.
