HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 9

DESIGNATING MARCH 2023 AS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH IN DELAWARE AND HONORING THE LEADERSHIP AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF WOMEN THROUGHOUT OUR STATE'S RICH HISTORY.
