HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 152nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY

HOUSE BILL NO. 5

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 31 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO REIMBURSEMENT OF SCHOOL-BASED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES.

1	WHEREAS, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services reimburses the State of Delaware approximately \$65
2	for every \$100 billed for allowable services provided to Medicaid-enrolled students; and
3	WHEREAS, the Delaware Medicaid State Plan currently limits the reimbursement of Medicaid-covered, school-
4	based behavioral health services to those provided under an Individualized Educational Program (IEP) or Individualized
5	Family Service Plan (IFSP); and
6	WHEREAS, in 2014, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services clarified that schools may seek
7	reimbursement for all medically necessary, Medicaid-covered services provided to students enrolled in Medicaid without ar
8	IEP or IFSP; and
9	WHEREAS, expanding reimbursement opportunities for school-based services could assist local education
10	agencies in providing critical access to behavioral health for children and reducing the cost of hiring school-based menta-
11	health professionals.
12	NOW, THEREFORE:
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:
14	Section 1. Amend Chapter 5, Title 31 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as show by strikethrough and
15	insertions as shown by underline as follows:
16	§ 532. Medicaid Reimbursement for School-Based Services.
17	(a) By January 1, 2024, the Department of Health and Social Services shall apply to the Centers for Medicare and
18	Medicaid Services for a State Plan Amendment that authorizes the State to provide for reimbursement for medically
19	necessary behavioral health services provided in a school setting to all individuals enrolled in the program or the Delaware
20	Children's Health Insurance Program, regardless of whether the services are provided under an Individualized Educational
21	Program or Individualized Family Service Plan.

22 (b) After the State Plan Amendment is approved, services provided in a school setting by a mental health provider 23 working within their scope of practice shall be reimbursed to the maximum extent permitted under federal and state law, 24 including services provided by all of the following: 25 (1) Behavioral health professionals certified by the Delaware Department of Education. (2) Behavior health professionals licensed by the Board of Mental Health and Chemical Dependency. 26 27 (3) Behavioral health professionals licensed by the Board of Social Work Examiners. 28 (b) Local education agencies must reinvest the funds reimbursed to support school-based behavioral health 29 programs and services, including mental health trainings for educators. 30 (c) Upon obtaining federal approval, the Department shall update its regulations and provider manuals to reflect 31 the changes to the program. 32 (d) The Department shall notify the Chief Clerk of the House and the Secretary of the Senate once they have

submitted the State Plan Amendment to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

The State's Medicaid Plan still limits the reimbursement of Medicaid-covered, school-based behavioral health services to those provided under an Individualized Educational Program (IEP) or Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP), despite federal policy changes that allow for these services to be provided as a medical necessity without IEP or IFSP documentation. This bill would charge the Department of Health & Social Services to apply to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a State Plan Amendment that would allow for reimbursement of medically necessary behavioral health services without IEP or IFSP documentation. Local education agencies must use the reimbursed funds to further invest in school-based behavioral health supports.
