DELAWARE STATE SENATE 152nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 45

	RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF MAY 2023 AS "HEALTHY VISION MONTH" IN THE STATE OF DELAWARE.
1	WHEREAS, during Healthy Vision Month, the National Eye Institute (NEI) reminds individuals to prioritize eye
2	health and protect their sight; and
3	WHEREAS, vision impairment and eye disease cost the United States \$68 billion annually in direct medical costs,
4	lost productivity, and other direct costs; and
5	WHEREAS, according to the American Foundation for the Blind, as of 2019, vision impairment affects 18,291
6	adults and 1,605 children under the age of 18 in Delaware; and
7	WHEREAS, children's vision screening is recommended at birth; and
8	WHEREAS, according to the CDC, just 1 out of every 7 preschoolers receive an eye exam, and fewer than 1 out
9	of every 4 receives some type of vision screening; and
10	WHEREAS, parents, teachers, and caregivers should monitor children carefully and make an appointment with an
11	eye physician at the first signs of vision problems; and
12	WHEREAS, serious vision issues disproportionately affect people of color, with glaucoma (after cataracts) being
13	the second leading cause of blindness in African Americans, and the glaucoma-related blindness rate for African Americans
14	being six times what it is for others, and half of African-Americans with glaucoma not realizing they have it; and
15	WHEREAS, regular dilated eye exams can detect eye disease and vision problems in the early stages when they
16	are easiest to treat; and
17	WHEREAS, children from families with lower incomes and children who lack health insurance are more likely to
18	go without needed eyeglasses; and
19	WHEREAS, children with poor vision can have difficulty participating in class, suffer from low self-esteem, and
20	receive low grades; and
21	WHEREAS, research has documented eye glasses for school students help improve academic achievement.
