## DELAWARE STATE SENATE 152nd GENERAL ASSEMBLY

## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 74

WHEREAS, Women Veterans Day is acknowledged as an effort to honor the work of women in the United States

PROCLAIMING MONDAY, JUNE 12, 2023, AS "WOMEN VETERANS DAY" IN THE STATE OF DELAWARE.

2	Armed Forces and recognizes the unique challenges women have faced; and
3	WHEREAS, women have formally been a part of the United States Armed Forces since the inception of the Army
4	Nurse Corps in 1901, but have informally served since the inception of our nation's military; and
5	WHEREAS, women have proudly served their country throughout all periods of the history of the United States:
6	disguising themselves as male soldiers during the American Revolutionary War and Civil War, serving as nurses in both
7	World Wars, flying combat helicopters in Afghanistan, and serving in countless other ways; and
8	WHEREAS, it was not until well after World War II that women who served in the military began to be officially
9	recognized as Veterans; and
10	WHEREAS, it was on June 12, 1948, when President Harry S. Truman signed into law the Women's Armed
1	Services Integration Act of 1948, which allowed women the right to serve as permanent, regular members of the United
12	States Army, United States Navy, United States Marine Corps, and United States Air Force. Previously, only women nurses
13	could serve in the regular and reserve forces during peacetime; and
14	WHEREAS, today, there are almost two million women Veterans in the United States and of those, over 7,000
15	reside in Delaware; and
16	WHEREAS, though not officially recognized for many years, women have served in America's wars throughout
17	our history, demonstrating their unwavering commitment, resilience, and courage in defending our nation; and
18	WHEREAS, Delaware honors the tremendous sacrifices our women in uniform have made in order to defend our
19	country; and
20	WHEREAS, it is Delaware's duty to honor the memory of our dedicated servicewomen who never returned home,
21	having made the ultimate sacrifice to preserve our nation and its way of life; and
