SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 66

DESIGNATING AUGUST 4, 2018 AS "BARACK OBAMA DAY" IN THE STATE OF DELAWARE.

1 WHEREAS, President Barack Obama, born in Honolulu, Hawaii on August 4, 1961, served as the 44th President
2 of the United States from 2009 to 2017, having the distinction of being America's first African American president, after
3 having served previously in the U.S. Senate representing the State of Illinois from 2005 to 2008, and in the Illinois State
4 Senate from 1997 to 2004; and

5 WHEREAS, President Obama served in the Oval Office for eight years with Delaware's own Joe Biden as his
6 vice-president, the two of them heading an administration characterized by honor and integrity; and

7 WHEREAS, during his first two years in office, President Obama signed many landmark bills into law, including
8 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, the
9 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 and the Tax Relief, Unemployment Insurance Reauthorization and Job
10 Creation Act of 2010, which served as an important economic stimulus during the so-called "Great Recession"; and

11 WHEREAS, in the area of foreign policy, President Obama increased U.S. troop levels in the ongoing war in
12 Afghanistan, reduced nuclear weapons with the U.S.-Russian New START treaty, and ended military involvement in the
13 Iraq War, in addition to which, he ordered the military operation that resulted in the death of Osama bin Laden; and

14 WHEREAS, he brokered a nuclear agreement with Iran resulting in an agreement by that nation to halt efforts to
15 build a nuclear weapons capability, and took steps to normalize U.S. relations with Cuba; and

16 WHEREAS, President Obama issued wide-ranging executive actions concerning climate change and immigration
17 and promoted discussions that led to the 2015 Paris Agreement on global climate change; and

18 WHEREAS, in response to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, he initiated sanctions against Russia; and

19 WHEREAS, during his second term, President Obama led efforts to support greater inclusiveness for LGBT
20 Americans, having his administration support marriage equality; and

21 WHEREAS, President Obama and his remarkable First Lady, Michelle Robinson Obama, and their two daughters,
22 Malia and Sasha, charmed the nation and the world during their years in the White House; and

23 WHEREAS, President Obama left a legacy of sterling public service and integrity when he left office in January,
24 2017; and

25 WHEREAS, August 4, 2018, will mark the 57th birthday of this remarkable American;

26 NOW, THEREFORE:

27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 149th General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the House of
28 Representatives concurring therein, that August 4, 2018, is hereby designated as “Barack Obama Day” in the State of
29 Delaware, and the members urge all citizens of the First State to recognize this event and participate fittingly in its
30 observance.

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that suitably prepared copies of this resolution be forwarded to President and Mrs.
32 Obama and to Vice President and Mrs. Joseph R. Biden, Jr.
