## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 11

## RECOGNIZING APRIL 7-13, 2019, AS "CRIME VICTIMS' RIGHTS WEEK" IN THE STATE OF DELAWARE.

1	WHEREAS, crime can leave a lasting impact on any person, regardless of age, national origin, race, creed,
2	religion, gender, sexual orientation, immigration, or economic status; and
3	WHEREAS, with the unwavering support of their communities and victim service providers behind them, victims
4	and survivors of crime will be empowered to face their grief, loss, fear, anger, and hope without fear of judgment, and will
5	feel understood, heard, and respected; and
6	WHEREAS, serving victims and survivors rebuilds their trust, which in turn restores their hope and supports
7	thriving communities; and
8	WHEREAS, incorporating communities' existing experts and trusted sources of support into efforts to fully serve
9	victims and survivors will develop a criminal justice system response that is truly accessible and appropriate for all victims;
10	and
11	WHEREAS, engaging a broader array of healthcare providers, community leaders, faith organizations, educators,
12	and businesses can provide new links between victims and survivors and services that improve their safety, healing, and
13	access to justice; and
14	WHEREAS, honoring the rights of victims and survivors of crime, including the rights to be heard and treated
15	with fairness, dignity, and respect, and working to meet their needs rebuilds their trust in the criminal justice and social
16	service systems; and
17	WHEREAS, Delaware's annual Crime Victims' Rights Week, held in coordination with the National Crime
18	Victims' Rights Week each April, provides an opportunity to recommit to ensuring that all victims and survivors of crime,
19	especially those who are challenging to reach or serve, are offered culturally- and linguistically-accessible and appropriate
20	services in the aftermath of crime; and
21	WHEREAS, this commemorative week celebrates the energy, perseverance, and commitment that launched the
22	victims' rights movement 4 decades ago, inspired its progress, and continues to advance the cause of justice for crime
23	victims; and

- 24 WHEREAS, Delaware's Victims' Bill of Rights is codified in Chapter 94 of Title 11; and
- 25 WHEREAS, the General Assembly is dedicated to strengthening victims and survivors in the aftermath of crime,
- 26 building resilience in Delaware's communities and victim responders, and working toward a better future for all victims
- and survivors.
- 28 NOW, THEREFORE:
- 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 150th General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the
- 30 Senate concurring therein, that April 7-13, 2019, is recognized as "Crime Victims' Rights Week" in the State of Delaware.
