DELAWARE STATE SENATE 150th GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 43

DESIGNATING THE WEEK OF MAY 19-25, 2019 AS "LYME DISEASE AWARENESS WEEK" IN THE STATE OF DELAWARE.

1 WHEREAS, Lyme disease is a bacterial infection caused by the bacterium Borrelia burgdorferi; and 2 WHEREAS, Lyme disease can result in severe and lasting effects in human beings, including neurological impacts 3 and joint disease; and 4 WHEREAS, Lyme disease is most commonly transmitted through the bite of a deer tick (lcodes scapularis), and 5 individuals may have the disease even if they do not have a red bull's eye rash that is often identified as a marker for Lyme disease: and 6 7 WHEREAS, some patients treated for Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases will experience lingering 8 symptoms such as fatigue, pain, and impaired cognitive function that may persist for months or years after treatment; and 9 WHEREAS, Delaware has one of the highest incidence rate of Lyme disease per 100,000 people in the United 10 States; and 11 WHEREAS, the climate of Delaware makes for an ideal environment for the bacterium-carrying deer tick; and 12 WHEREAS, Delaware, as a state of high incidence of Lyme disease, has a responsibility to the growing number of 13 Delawareans who have had, or know an individual who has had, this disease to combat it and manage its pervasiveness; and 14 WHEREAS, Delaware is one of the few states that is dedicated to investigating each possible case of Lyme 15 disease reported to the Bureau of Epidemiology; and 16 WHEREAS, May has been recognized as National Lyme Disease Awareness Month. 17 NOW, THEREFORE: 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 150th General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the House of 19 Representatives concurring therein, that the Legislature affirms the importance of Lyme disease awareness and prevention, 20 and hereby designates May 19-25, 2019 as "Lyme Disease Awareness Week" in the State of Delaware. 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature encourages expanded efforts to keep Delaware residents 22 properly informed about Lyme disease prevention, symptom recognition, and treatment.
