HOUSE AMENDMENT NO. 1
TO
HOUSE BILL NO. 184

1 AMEND House Bill No. 184 on line 6 by deleting “recoverable feedstocks” after “which” and before “are” therein
2 and inserting in lieu thereof “post-use polymers”.

3 FURTHER AMEND House Bill No. 184 on lines 12 through 13 by deleting “and recoverable feedstocks” as it
4 appears therein.

5 FURTHER AMEND House Bill No. 184 by deleting lines 31 through 46 in their entirety and inserting in lieu
6 thereof the following:

7 “() “Post-use polymer” means a plastic polymer that has gone through a recycling process.”.

8 FURTHER AMEND House Bill No. 184 by deleting lines 56 through 90 in their entirety and inserting in lieu
9 thereof the following:

10 “() “Recycling” means the process by which recyclable materials, which would otherwise be disposed of as
11 solid waste, are returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw materials or products.

12 () “Recyclable material” means a solid waste that exhibits the potential to be used repeatedly in place of
13 virgin material.”.

SYNOPSIS

This Amendment clarifies that while the recycling process itself requires a solid waste permit, when recycling occurs elsewhere and only raw materials and products are being accepted for the gasification and pyrolysis process, a solid waste permit is not required.
