DELAWARE STATE SENATE 150th GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE BILL NO. 227

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 21 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO COMMERCIAL LEARNER PERMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

Section 1. Amend § 2608, Title 21 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

2 insertions as shown by underline as follows: 3 § 2608. Commercial driver license qualification standards. (d) Commercial learner permit (CLP). — (1) The issuance of a CLP is a precondition to the initial issuance of a 4 5 CDL. A CLP may be issued to an individual who has satisfied all of the following requirements: 6 a. Is at least 18 years of age; age. 7 b. Holds a valid Delaware driver license; and license. 8 c. Has passed the vision and written tests required for a CDL. 9 (2) The CLP may not be issued for a period to exceed 6 months. that does not exceed 1 year. Only 1 renewal 10 or re-issuance may be granted within a 1-year period. The 1-year period shall begin begins with the issuance date of the 11 original permit. The holder of a CLP may, unless otherwise disqualified, drive a commercial motor vehicle only when 12 accompanied by the holder of a commercial driver license, valid for the type of vehicle driven who occupies a seat 13 beside the individual for the purpose of giving instruction in driving the commercial motor vehicle; provided that the 14 CLP holder may not operate a commercial motor vehicle transporting hazardous materials as defined in § 2603 of this

SYNOPSIS

This Act brings the Division of Motor Vehicles into compliance with federal law by allowing a commercial learner permit to be issued for a period of up to 1 year.

This Act also makes technical corrections to conform existing law to the standards of the Delaware Legislative Drafting Manual.
