DELAWARE STATE SENATE 151st GENERAL ASSEMBLY

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 44

CREATING AN AGING-IN-PLACE WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES.

1 WHEREAS, it is imperative to implement policies that will best support the needs of Delaware's rapidly growing 2 population of senior citizens and their families; and 3 WHEREAS, the overwhelming majority of senior citizens, and 76% of Americans over age 50, report wanting to 4 stay in their own homes for as long as possible; and 5 WHEREAS, aging-in-place promotes increased health and self-esteem in senior citizens, increased satisfaction 6 from their families, and offers increased protection from highly infectious diseases like COVID-19; and 7 WHEREAS, robust home and community-based services enable successful aging-in-place; and 8 WHEREAS, in addition to home health care, home and community-based services provide aging 9 Delawareans with critical supports, such as home-delivered food, transportation, and personal care services; and 10 WHEREAS, home and community-based services are delivered by public, private, and nonprofit organizations across Delaware; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the cost of in-home care and access to home and community-based support services present 13 significant barriers to the long-term viability of seniors aging-in-place; and 14 WHEREAS, according to a 2019 survey from Genworth Financial on the cost of long-term care, the national average cost for a home health aide is \$4,385 a month; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in addition to facilitating successful aging-in-place, robust home and community-based 17 services have the potential to cut costs for individuals and the State; and 18 WHEREAS, seniors from racial and ethnic minority groups encounter additional barriers, including 19 cultural bias, when accessing services, ensuring that services are culturally competent is critical; and

20	WHEREAS, Delaware should seek to identify policy solutions that increase the equity, availability, and
21	affordability of home and community-based services; and
22	WHEREAS, Delaware should be proactive in building a strong statewide home and community-based
23	service infrastructure to support its aging and diversifying population and should work to enable residents to
24	remain in their homes and community as long as possible.
25	NOW THEREFORE:
26	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the 151st General Assembly of the State of Delaware, the House of
27	Representatives concurring therein, that an Aging-In-Place Working Group is established to identify and develop policy
28	recommendations to improve Delaware's home and community-based services infrastructure with the goal of
29	allowing aging Delawareans to remain in their own home and community safely, independently and
30	comfortably, regardless of age, income, or ability.
31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Working Group be composed of the following members:
32	(1) A Senator from the Majority Caucus, appointed by the President Pro Tempore, who shall serve as
33	Co-Chair.
34	(2) A Representative from the Majority Caucus, appointed by the Speaker of the House, who shall serve
35	as Co-Chair.
36	(3) A Senator from the Minority Caucus, appointed by the President Pro Tempore.
37	(4) A Representative from the Minority Caucus, appointed by the Speaker of the House.
38	(5) A representative of the Department of Health & Social Services, representing the Division of Services
39	for Aging and Adults with Physical Disabilities.
40	(6) A representative of the Department of Health & Social Services, representing the Division of
41	Medicaid and Medical Assistance.
42	(7) A representative of the AARP, appointed by the Director of the AARP Delaware.
43	(8) A representative of the Alzheimer's Association Delaware Valley Chapter.
44	(9) A representative of the Delaware Aging Network.
45	(10) A representative of the Delaware Healthcare Association.
46	(11) A representative of the Delaware Association of Home and Community Care.
47	(12) Five members of the public, appointed by the Governor, representing the following categories: an
48	adult social service provider; an adult care recipient; an adult caregiver; a senior center representative; and a

representative of a federally qualified health center. Public appointees should include individuals from diverse backgrounds, and efforts should be made to appoint representatives from all three counties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is to deliver recommendations on policies and implementation strategies to the General Assembly by March 30, 2022.

SYNOPSIS

This Concurrent Resolution creates an Aging-in-Place Working Group that will develop a plan to guide policies designed to promote successful aging-in-place for seniors in Delaware. The group will deliver preliminary recommendations to the General Assembly by March 30, 2022.
