SENATE BILL NO. 230

Section 1. Amend § 543, Title 4 of the Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 4 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

3	§ 543. Grounds for refusal of license; transfer or extension of premises.
4	(d) The Commissioner shall refuse to grant a license for the sale of alcoholic liquor by any store, or establishment
5	for consumption off the premises, when there is an existing licensed establishment of similar type within \underline{a} ½ mile by
6	accessible public road or street in any incorporated city or town, or within 3 miles by accessible public road or street in any
7	unincorporated or rural area measured in driving distance both ways between the existing and proposed establishments.
8	This subsection does not apply to any of the following:
9	(1) An existing license or to the sale, transfer of ownership, or renewal of an existing license.
10	(2) A club licensed to sell off the premises where sold, farm winery, brewery-pub, microbrewery, or craft
1	distillery.
12	(3) A licensee who desires to move the location of the license to a location within 500 feet thereof by
13	accessible public road or street. However, a licensee located in a shopping center or shopping mall may move the
14	location of the license any distance within the same shopping center or shopping mall, whether such center or mall
15	consist of 1 or more than 1 separate buildings.
16	(4) An applicant for an off premises license whose license location meets 1 of the following:
17	a. Is between 1800 feet and ½ mile from an existing license of similar type in any incorporated city or
18	town, if the applicant can provide a report, determined reliable by the Commissioner after written input from the
19	Division that indicates either of the following:
20	1. A minimum yearly increase of 1% in the population of individuals 21 years old or older over the
21	past 3 consecutive years measured from the month before the submission of the application.

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22	2. A minimum increase of 3% in the population of individuals 21 years old or older in the past year
23	measured from the month before the submission of the application within a distance of ½ mile from the
24	borders of the property where the applicant seeks licensure.
25	b. Is between 1½ miles and 3 miles from an existing license of similar type in any unincorporated or rural
26	area if the applicant can provide a report, determined reliable by the Commissioner after written input from the
27	Division that indicates either of the following:
28	1. A minimum yearly increase of 1% in the population of individuals 21 years old or older over the
29	past 3 consecutive years measured from the month before the submission of the application.
30	2. A minimum increase of 3% in the population of individuals 21 years old or older in the past year
31	measured from the month before the submission of the application within a distance of 1½ miles from the
32	borders of the property where the applicant seeks licensure. [Repealed.]
33	(e) The Commissioner may grant a new license to a licensee whose license was valid on December 31, 2019, and
34	who desires to move the location of the license due to the destruction of the building, loss of lease, diversion of highway
35	traffic pattern, or similar reason beyond the control of the licensee a new license licensee, if the application satisfies this
36	subsection; meets all of the following:
37	(1) The requirements under subsection (d) of this section, as in effect before January 1, 2020; section and all
38	other requirements under this title.
39	(2) The location to which the licensee proposes to move meets either of the following:
10	a. If in an incorporated city or town, is within 500 feet of the existing location of the licensee.
11	b. If in an unincorporated or rural area, is within a ½ mile by accessible public road or street of the
12	existing location of the licensee.
	SYNODSIS

<u>SYNOPSIS</u>

This Act removes the exemption in § 543(d)(4) of Title 4 (reduced distance requirements based on population growth) to the prohibition against granting a license for the sale of alcoholic liquor if there is an existing licensed establishment of similar type within either of the following:

- (1) A ½ mile by accessible public road or street in any incorporated city or town.
- (2) Within 3 miles by accessible public road or street in any unincorporated or rural area.

This Act permits the Commissioner to grant a new license if all of the following apply:

- (1) The licensee desires to move the location of the license due to the destruction of the building, loss of lease, diversion of highway traffic pattern, or similar reason beyond the control of the licensee.
- (2) The application meets the requirements of § 543(d) of Title 4 of the Delaware Code and the other requirements of Title 4.
- (3) The new license does not result in the licensee moving the location more than 500 feet in an incorporated city or town or a ½ mile in an unincorporated or rural area.

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
