DESCRIPTION:

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 19 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE.

Assumptions:

- 1. Effective upon signature of the Governor
- 2. This Bill will increase the minimum wage:
 - Not less than \$8.25 per hour to \$8.75 per hour, effective October 1, 2018;
 - Not less than \$8.75 per hour to \$9.25 per hour, effective October 1, 2019;
 - Not less than \$9.25 per hour to \$9.75 per hour, effective October 1, 2020;
 - Not less than \$9.75 per hour to \$10.25 per hour, effective October 1, 2021;
- 3. This Bill will impact the full-time employees of the State making less than \$17,063 and working 37.5 hours per week in FY 2019, \$18,038 and working 37.5 hours per week in FY 2020, \$19,013 and working 37.5 hours per week in FY 2021, and \$19,988 and working 37.5 hours per week in FY 2021.

In addition, this Bill will impact the full-time employees of the State making less than \$18,200 and working 40 hours per week in FY 2019, \$19,240 and working 40 hours per week in FY 2020, \$20,280 and working 40 hours per week in FY 2021, and \$21,320 and working 40 hours per week in FY 2022.

- 4. This Bill will impact various substitute positions (Class C substitutes, clerks, aides) within the State's public schools and charter schools but the cost is minimal and thus not included in the overall projection.
- 5. Other Employee Costs are included in the projections to include a rate of 30.98% for full-time employees and 9.32% for non-full-time employees.
- 6. This Bill will impact positions compensated through the State's General Fund (GF), Appropriated Special Funds (ASF), and Non-Appropriated Special Funds (NSF).
- 7. Assumes no other cost of living adjustments FY 2019 through FY 2023.
