# HOUSE BILL NO. 521

1	AMEND House Bill No. 521 by deleting lines 1 and 2 and replacing as follows:
2	Section 1. Amend Chapter 33 of Title 18 of the Delaware Code by enacting the following as a new Section
3	§3344. Annual Pap Smear Coverage Reimbursement as follows:
4	§3344. Annual Pap Smear Coverage Reimbursement.
5	All individual health insurance policies which are delivered or issued for delivery in this State by
6	any health insurer, health service corporation, health maintenance organization or any health services and
7	facilities reimbursement program operated by the State and which provides a benefit for outpatient services
8	shall also provide a benefit for an annual benefit for one cervical and endometrial cancer screening known
9	as a "pap smear" for all females aged 18 and over.
10	This section shall apply to all policies, contracts, certificates or programs issued, renewed,
11	modified, altered, amended, or reissued on or after January 1, 2001."
12	Section 2. Amend Chapter 35 of Title 18 of the Delaware Code by enacting the following as a new
13	Section §3559. Annual Pap Smear Coverage Reimbursement as follows:
14	"§3559. Annual Pap Smear Coverage Reimbursement.
15	All group and blanket health insurance policies which are delivered or issued for delivery in this
16	State by any health insurer, health service corporation, health maintenance organization or any health services and
17	facilities reimbursement program operated by the State and which provides a benefit for outpatient services shall
18	also provide a benefit for an annual benefit for one cervical and endometrial cancer screening known as a "pap
19	smear" for all females aged 18 and over."

- This section shall apply to all policies, contracts, certificates or programs issued, renewed, modified, altered, amended or reissued on or after January 1, 2001."

## **SYNOPSIS**

This Amendment establishes coverage for annual pap smears for cervical and endometrial cancer in contracts for health insurance issued after January 1, 2001.
