HOUSE BILL NO. 706

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 7 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1 Section 1. Amend § 6454, Title 7 of the Delaware Code, by inserting an “(a)” before the first paragraph
2 and inserting the following new paragraphs “(b)”, “(c)”, and “(d)”:

3 “(b) The owner, landlord, operator or tenant of any retail store having a gross retail area in excess of
4 50,000 square feet which is constructed or to which parking space is added after September 1, 2000 shall
5 make available on a continuous basis a suitable area, not less than 80 feet by 100 feet, in the parking area
6 for such store or other appropriate adjacent area, upon request and as designated by the Authority, without
7 cost, for the establishment and operation of a ‘RECYCLE DELAWARE’ center;

8 “(c) The State agency owning or managing any state facility, excluding parks and natural/wildlife areas, that
9 have not exceeded a 75 percent parking capacity in its parking area or any state facility constructed or
10 adding parking space area after July 1, 2000 shall make available on a continuous basis a suitable area, not
11 less than 80 feet by 100 feet, in the paved area of the facility upon request and as designated by the
12 Authority, without cost, for the establishment and operation of a ‘RECYCLE DELAWARE’ center; and

13 “(d) All public school districts with schools that have not exceeded 75 percent of their parking capacity or
14 any public school constructed after July 1, 2000 or that creates additional parking capacity after July 1,
15 2000 shall make available on a continuous basis a suitable area, not less than 80 feet by 100 feet, in the
16 paved area of the school, upon request and as designated by the Authority, without cost, for the
17 establishment and operation of a ‘RECYCLE DELAWARE’ center.”

SYNOPSIS

This bill requires new shopping centers, new schools and existing state agencies or schools with excess parking areas to make available a suitable area for sitting of a Recycle Delaware center.
