HOUSE BILL NO. 450

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 9 RELATING TO NEW CASTLE COUNTY GOVERNMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1	Section 1. Amend Title 9, Chapter 11, of the Delaware Code by creating a new subchapter to read as follows:
2	"Subchapter VI. County Oversight and Integrity Commission.
3	§ 1190. County Oversight and Integrity Commission.
4	There shall be a special County Oversight and Integrity Commission, consisting of three (3)
5	members, which shall have the powers, duties and responsibilities set forth in this subchapter.
6	§ 1191. Qualifications and Appointment of Commission Members.
7	The Governor, President Pro Tempore of the State Senate, and Speaker of the House of
8	Representatives shall each appoint one (1) of the members of the Commission. The Commission members
9	shall not be officials or employees of New Castle County. The member appointed by the Governor shall be
10	the Chair.
11	§ 1192. Powers, Duties and Responsibilities.
12	The Commission shall have the following powers, duties and responsibilities:
13	(a) To review and approve all proposed County contracts, expenditures, payments, or debts
14	incurred in excess of \$10,000.00 to determine the precise purpose therefore, to determine
15	that no conflict of interest exists, and to determine that any proposed expenditure, payment
16	or debt incurred is in accordance with the approved budget. The County shall not make,
17	and County Council shall not consider, any contract, expenditure, payment or debt in
18	excess of \$10,000.00 until the Commission has completed its review and approval thereof.
19	The Commission shall not approve any such contract, expenditure, payment or the
20	incurrence of any debt only in those instances where the Commission finds such not to be

for a proper County purpose, where there is a conflict of interest, or where such is not in accordance with the approved budget. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Commission shall not review and need not approve any regularly scheduled bond payments or any routine and regularly scheduled personnel expenses, including payroll and benefits, should any such payments or expenses exceed \$10,000.00.

- (b) To review and approve all proposed hiring, all proposed reassignments, all proposed 26 27 disciplinary actions, all proposed bonuses, and all proposed firings or layoffs, to determine 28 the precise reasons therefore, to determine that no conflict of interest exists, and that no 29 such actions are for an improper purpose. The County shall not undertake any proposed 30 hiring, reassignment, disciplinary action, bonus or firing or layoff, and County Council 31 shall not consider any such action, until the Commission has completed its review and 32 approval thereof. The Commission shall not approve any such action only in those 33 instances where the Commission finds such not to be for a proper County purpose, where 34 there is a conflict of interest, or where such is not in accordance with approved personnel 35 policies of the County or the approved budget.
- In order to carry out the powers and duties set forth in this subchapter, the Commission 36 (c) 37 shall have access to all County books, records, accounts, and documents, including but not 38 limited to all computer records and emails of County employees and officials; the 39 Commission shall further have the power to issue subpoenas in accordance with the power 40 granted to the County Attorney under § 1397 of this Title; the Commission shall further 41 have the power to hire staff and outside professionals, as the Commission deems necessary, 42 as well as to pay for all other costs (printing, utilities, rent, office equipment, etc.) 43 necessary or convenient for the Commission to carry on its work. All such expenses shall 44 be timely paid by New Castle County government.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of Title 9 of this Code, or any ordinance or regulation
 which may have been passed by New Castle County Council during the existence of the
 Commission, the County Auditor and the Auditor's staff shall report to and work at the
 direction of the Commission, and shall assist the Commission in performing its duties.
 - (e) All decisions of the Commission shall be by majority vote.

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50	§ 1193. Freezing of Certain Funds.
51	Notwithstanding New Castle County Council's prior approval of certain spending by the County
52	Executive in various contingency funds, designated County Executive's Contingency Funds in the most
53	recent New Castle County budget, or as otherwise approved by New Castle County Council, no payments or
54	expenditures of any kind shall be made in connection with such funds.
55	§ 1194. Limited Duration.
56	The Commission's powers set forth in § 1192, and the existence of the Commission, shall cease as
57	of the first Tuesday in January, 2005.
58	§ 1195. Effective Date.
59	This bill shall become effective upon its enactment into law.".

SYNOPSIS

New Castle County is a political subdivision created by the General Assembly and subject to oversight by the General Assembly. Recent events call into question certain spending and other actions of New Castle County. This spending and these actions occurred despite the responsibility of New Castle County Council to oversee the actions of the Executive Branch, and it is doubtful that County Council will be any more effective going forward than it has been in the past. Therefore, this bill creates a special Commission to be charged with reviewing and approving ongoing spending and other actions by New Castle County, to ensure that such spending is for proper purposes and in accordance with applicable law. The Commission is not a policy-making body, has no policy-making role, and is only responsible to ensure that County tax dollars are spent correctly and in accordance with law. It is absolutely critical that the citizens of New Castle County and the State have complete confidence in their county government.

This bill also freezes certain funds appropriated by New Castle County Council to the New Castle County Executive for the Executive's discretionary and unregulated expenditure without any further oversight from County Council or the people of New Castle County.
