<b>SPONSOR:</b>	<b>Senator Lopez</b>
<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	<b>AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 21 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO REVOKED LICENSE OR DRIVING PRIVILEGES FEES.</b>

**Assumptions:**

1. This Act becomes effective upon signature by the Governor.
2. This Act exempts individuals from having to pay the \$200 revoked license or driving privileges reinstatement fee if the individual is eligible for and applies for reinstatement within 1 year of release from Department of Correction Level V custody.
3. The Department of Transportation does not collect incarceration data, only revocation data. Using the last three years of revocation data, an average of 2,383 revocations occur annually. The Department of Transportation estimates that an average of 5% of total revocations (119 annually) may be related to incarceration.
4. Based on the estimated 119 annual revocations attributable to incarcerations, the Department of Transportation would see revenue losses of \$23,800 annually (119 x \$200) upon implementation of this Act.
