

151st GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL NOTE

BILL: HOUSE BILL NO. 129

SPONSOR: Representative K. Williams

DESCRIPTION: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 14 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO

EDUCATION.

Assumptions:

1. This Act becomes effective upon signature by the Governor.

- 2. This Act requires high needs elementary schools, including high needs charter schools, to have school-based health centers (SBHCs).
- 3. This Act requires the State to bear the start-up costs for SBHCs at a rate of two high needs elementary school SBHCs per fiscal year until such time as all applicable high needs elementary schools are in compliance.
- 4. This Act allows for reimbursement of costs associated with SBHCs already established in high needs elementary schools.
- 5. The State has provided one-time funding for start-up costs of SBHCs in public high schools in the amount of \$5,000 per SBHC. These start-up costs are assumed to remain the same for all SBHCs.
- 6. The State currently provides annual funding for operations of SBHCs in public high schools at a base formula of \$170,000 per SBHC (based on a 1,000 student high school) with an additional allowance of \$100 per student over the 1,000 student threshold. Until further data is available on actual operational costs of elementary SBHCs, it is assumed that \$170,000 will be the annual operational funding requirement per elementary SBHC.
- 7. Based on the criteria of high needs elementary schools established in this Act, there is a minimum of 20 elementary schools currently eligible for SBHCs. At a rate of two SBHCs funded per year, it will take a minimum of 10 years for full implementation.
