HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 146th GENERAL ASSEMBLY

HOUSE BILL NO. 86

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 7 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO TERMINATING THE REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE AND CO2 EMISSION TRADING PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, Delaware's participation in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) has a goal of reducing 2 carbon dioxide (CO2) production; and 3 WHEREAS, the goal of RGGI is to reduce CO2 emissions by 10% by 2019 from Delaware electrical power plants 4 over 25 megawatts in size; and 5 WHEREAS, Delaware has already far exceeded the goal of 10% reduction by 2019; and 6 WHEREAS, changes already in effect have reduced emissions 41%; and 7 WHEREAS, Delaware's high cost of electricity is costing approximately \$500 per home per year in higher energy 8 costs; and 9 WHEREAS, employers leave the State or decide not to locate in Delaware due to its 50% higher electricity costs; 10 and 11 WHEREAS, New Hampshire, New Jersey, and Maine are considering terminating; and 12 WHEREAS, the decade-long effort in Delaware is replaced by increased emissions in China every 68 seconds; and 13 WHEREAS, program revenues are collected and mostly spent by non-transparent, non-governmental 14 organizations and the loss of this revenue will not significantly impact the State budget; and 15 WHEREAS, the impact of the energy efficiency improvements of the program are less than 1% of the 16 unsubsidized annual energy efficiency improvements in the general economy attributable to normal market forces. 17 NOW THEREFORE: 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE: 19 Section 1. Amend Chapter 60, Title 7, Delaware Code by striking Subchapter II-A in its entirety. **SYNOPSIS**

This bill terminates Delaware's participation in the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative and will save money for every electricity user in Delaware.
