

151st GENERAL ASSEMBLY REVISED FISCAL NOTE

BILL: SENATE BILL NO. 209

SPONSOR: Senator Paradee

DESCRIPTION: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 2 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO

TRANSPORTATION AND INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE DELAWARE TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, PUBLIC CARRIERS, AND TRANSPORTATION

NETWORK COMPANIES.

Assumptions:

1. Upon signature by the Governor, this Act takes effect July 1, 2022.

- 2. This Act requires the Delaware Transportation Authority (DTA) and public carriers, as defined by Chapter 18, Title 2, to increase the death, bodily injury, and property damage insurance coverage from \$300,000 to \$1,000,000 per single occurrence.
- 3. This Act also requires public carriers, Transportation Network Companies (TNC), and the DTA to possess coverage for uninsured and underinsured claims in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per incident.
- 4. The impact of the increased coverages to the DTA is uncertain. According to the Delaware Transit Corporation (DART) Claims Administrator, the organization estimates that the addition of uninsured/underinsured motorist coverage would likely increase claim occurrences approximately 35% 50%, or 96 claims per year.
- 5. There are currently an average of 240 claims per year with an average amount of \$14,500 per claim and a \$1,200 claim administration fee. Increased costs to the Transportation Trust Fund consider an increase in claims at current per claim amounts.
- 6. The Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) anticipates an impact of the increased coverages to the State's Medicaid transportation program, currently contracted through a third-party vendor. The Division of Medicaid and Medical Assistance (DMMA) estimates a change in the per member per month (PMPM) proposed cost of \$1.31 bringing the overall total to \$11.01 PMPM. Cost projections of the PMPM rate were calculated using the blended Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) of 36.075% presuming a COVID FMAP increase through June 30, 2022.
- 7. Currently, DMMA reports 258,417 clients who require the need for transportation. With the proposed PMPM rate, anticipated costs would total \$34,142,054. Of that cost, the proposed State Share would be \$12,316,746; a difference of \$1,465,480 over the current cost for FY23.
