

## **151st GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL NOTE**

**DESCRIPTION:** 

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 6 AND TITLE 31 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE HOMELESS.

## Assumptions:

- 1. This Act becomes effective upon signature by the Governor; however, it is to be implemented the earlier of one year from the date of enactment or notice by the Chair of the Human Relations Commission that the required regulations have been promulgated.
- 2. This Act creates a "Homeless Individuals Bill of Rights", providing for the protection for individuals experiencing homelessness from discrimination while in public places while seeking access to housing, employment, or temporary shelter.
- 3. This Act empowers the Department of State's Division of Human Relations and the State Human Relations Commission with the authority to investigate and enforce the Homeless Individuals Bill of Rights.
- 4. To implement the provisions of this Act, the Division of Human Relations estimates a one-time fiscal impact of \$38,000 for a contract attorney (equivalent to a State Deputy Attorney General V position whose average salary and benefits total \$76 per hour) for 500 hours, to assist in drafting regulations related to the Homeless Individuals Bill of Rights. The Division of Human Relations also estimates an ongoing fiscal impact of \$3,000 for annual training and educational costs for Human Relations representatives.
