## DELAWARE STATE SENATE 148th GENERAL ASSEMBLY

## SENATE BILL NO. 263

## AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 11 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO HATE CRIMES

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1 Section 1. Amend §1304(a), Title 11, Delaware Code by making deletions as shown by strike through and 2 insertions as shown by underline as follows: 3 § 1304 Hate crimes; class A misdemeanor, class G felony, class F felony, class E felony, class D felony, class C 4 felony, class B felony, class A felony. 5 (a) Any person who commits, or attempts to commit, any crime as defined by the laws of this State, and who 6 intentionally: 7 (1) Commits said crime for the purpose of interfering with the victim's free exercise or enjoyment of any 8 right, privilege or immunity protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution, or commits said 9 crime because the victim has exercised or enjoyed said rights; or 10 (2) Selects the victim because of the victim's race, religion, color, disability, sexual orientation, gender 11 identity, national origin or ancestry, or because the person is a law-enforcement officer, a volunteer firefighter, a 12 full-time firefighter, emergency medical technician, paramedic, fire police officer, fire marshal, correctional 13 officer, a sheriff, a deputy sheriff, public transit operator, a code enforcement constable or a code enforcement 14 officer, shall be guilty of a hate crime. For purposes of this section, the term "sexual orientation" means 15 heterosexuality, bisexuality, or homosexuality, and the term "gender identity" means a gender-related identity,

appearance, expression or behavior of a person, regardless of the person's assigned sex at birth.

This Act would add an additional criminal penalty if the offense committed was due to the victim being a law-enforcement officer, a volunteer firefighter, a full-time firefighter, emergency medical technician, paramedic, fire police officer, fire marshal, correctional officer, a sheriff, a deputy sheriff, public transit operator, a code enforcement constable or a code enforcement officer.
