<b>DESCRIPTION:</b>	<b>AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 4 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS.</b>

*In accordance with 29 Del. C. § 913, the following information is provided relating to licenses and fees.*

**Description of the Legislation:**

This Act allows for the delivery of alcoholic liquors from a restaurant, brewpub, tavern, taproom, or other entity with a valid on-premises license.

**Affected Entities:**

The Office of Alcoholic Beverage Control Commissioner (OABCC) and the Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement.

**Fiscal Impact:**

This Act provides that a license to provide third-party delivery services shall be a biennial fee of \$1,000. The number of potential licenses is difficult to determine. For this fiscal projection, it is assumed that some of the most popular third-party delivery services for restaurants may apply to the OABCC for a license. However, the number of entities that may become licensed in the first fiscal year of authorization (Fiscal Year 2024) is unknown. Therefore, the additional revenue is indeterminable.

**Intended Use of Revenue:**

License fees are deposited to the General Fund.
