| DESCRIPTION: | AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 211, VOLUME 83 OF THE LAWS OF DELAWARE RELATING TO THE FOCUS ON ALTERNATIVE SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAM. |

Assumptions:

- 1. This Act becomes effective upon signature of the Governor.
- 2. This Act repeals the sunset of the Focus on Alternative Skills Training (FAST) Program, which provides tuition for an eligible individual to attend an approved non-degree credit certificate program that provides industry-accepted skill training and certification.
- 3. Per the original bill, Senate Substitute 1 for Senate Bill 65 of the 151st General Assembly, the program shall be paid for out of available general funds or eligible federal funds, not to exceed \$1 million.
- 4. The Department of Labor (DOL) carried out the FAST Program utilizing contracted services with federal funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of \$500,000. DOL will be required to obligate the funds by December 2024 and expend the funds by December 2026. DOL does not expect these ARPA funds to continue.
- 5. This Act makes permanent the duties of the DOL, Division of Employment and Training associated with the FAST Program. The program becoming permanent would require the following:
 - a. 1.0 FTE, Employment and Training Contract Specialist, to manage the procurement and vendors. The Fiscal Year 2024 personnel costs, including other employment costs (OECs) at a rate of 32.25%, for the position are estimated at \$72,354.
 - b. Annual administrative, rent, and supply costs are estimated at \$6,000.
- 6. A 2% inflation cost has been included for projected increases in salary, health insurance, and OECs.
