

153rd GENERAL ASSEMBLY FISCAL NOTE

BILL: SENATE BILL NO. 177

SPONSOR: Senator Hocker

DESCRIPTION: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 29 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO A

TRANSPORTATION APPEALS BOARD.

Assumptions:

1. This Act becomes effective upon signature of the Governor.

- 2. This Act creates a Transportation Appeals Board within the Department of Transportation (DOT). The quasi-judicial review board will review appeals of DOT actions such as grants or denials of transportation-related permits.
- 3. This Act expands upon the duties of the DOT. To implement the provisions of this Act, the DOT anticipates the need for the following:
 - a. Recurring Costs of \$155,445 for Personnel Costs, including OECs (at a rate of 33.34%), for 1.0 FTE Deputy Attorney General, 0.5 FTE Engineering/Planning/Surveying (EPS) Technician, and 0.5 FTE Administrative Specialist.
 - b. One-Time Costs of \$21,000 for computer equipment, software needs, and office furniture for the three new positions.
- 4. Fiscal Year 2026 personnel costs for the DOT are estimated at six months of funding and annualized in the following years. All personnel costs are estimated to increase at a rate of 2% annually.
