SPONSOR: Senator Buckson
DESCRIPTION: AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 4 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO PRIVATE EVENTS.

In accordance with 29 Del. C. § 913, the following information is provided relating to licenses and fees.

Description of the Legislation:

This Act creates a new private event license for private events at which alcoholic liquors are sold, served, or consumed on licensed premises. The Act authorizes two types of private event licenses: a single event license and a biennial premises license.

Affected Entities:

The Office of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commissioner (OABCC) and the Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement

Fiscal Impact:

This Act establishes two types of private event licenses as follows: (1) \$50 for a single event license valid only for the date and location specified, and (2) \$1,000 for a biennial premises license valid for any private event held on the licensed premises within 2 years.

It is difficult to determine how many licenses may be obtained and which license type would be applied for. The number of applicants for either a single-event license and for a biennial premises license is unknown and cannot be determined. Therefore, the additional revenue is indeterminable.

Intended Use of Revenue:

License fees are deposited into the General Fund.
